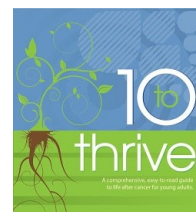
Developed in partnership with The Samfund, this toolkit helps people navigate finances after cancer, such as finding health insurance, getting financial help, managing medical bills, & more.
